LOCAL FLAVOURS OF MALACCA - For Asian Guests

Description

Did you know a bee has to visit 2 million flowers to produce 2.2 kg honey? The World's Bee Museum at Melaka would facilitate wider dissemination of knowledge about bee, honey and associated products. The museum was divided into different sections such as bee keeping, species of bees, bee habitat and traditional tools used for gathering honey. Visitors are able to try the fresh honey juice at the museum and also purchase honey and its by-products. Our next visit will be at Tan Kim Hock. Tan Kim Hock had very humble beginnings. In the early 1930s, he was seen peddling around town selling Dodol -- a soft candy made of, among others, coconut milk, rice starch, gula Melaka and some spices. After much perseverance, he set up a shop in 1939. Today, he has huge outlets in Malacca that sell more than 100 types of foodstuff. Much of the raw materials are grown in his estates and products are made in his own factories. Recently, he built a complex and a huge sales centre catering to tourists in order to concentrate his interests. In addition, his products are being exported to countries in the region as well as in the West. You too will have the opportunity to see the making of Melaka's famous, pineapple tart and browse around the shop to purchase these pineapple tarts or other local produce of Melaka. Finally you will visit Jonker Walk. Some people might perceive it as nothing more than a straight and narrow street. However, once you stepped into the entrance of the street, you will be amazed by what you see in each and every distinct shop. Along the street, you will have the privilege to taste specialize flavours of Peranakan whereby the descendants of Chinese immigrants who develops the culture that includes Nyonya (named after the Peranakan ladies). SCENIC DRIVE & MALACCA BY RIVER - For Asian Guests

Description

Our first photo stop today will be Porta de Santiago which was built by the Portuguese in 1511 as a fortress. It sustained severe structural damage during the Dutch invasion and, when the British took over Malacca, they set out to destroy it. Timely intervention by Sir Stamford Raffles, in 1808, preserved the remains you will see today. Next is Straits Mosque, from where you can admire the fascinating view of Malacca's bay. Head to the city via Bukit Cina Chinese Hill. This was the official settlement area of the entourage that arrived with the Chinese Princess Hang Li Po and remained here until the Portuguese occupation in 1511. Today, Bukit Cina is believed to hold one of the largest Chinese cemeteries outside China, with many of the tombs dating back to the Ming Dynasty. At the city center, you will visit Dutch Square. The Stadthuys, built in 1650, was the official residence of the Dutch Governors. It is one

of the major landmarks in Malacca and is believed to be the oldest Dutch building in the East. Originally white, it was later painted a striking salmon red color to match the nearby Christ Church. Queen Victoria's Diamond Jubilee fountain (1904) dominates the area. Another significant icon sits on Dutch Square the Red Clock Tower. It was built in 1886 in honor of a generous Chinese tycoon named Tan Beng Swee. Take some free time for souvenir shopping among an astonishing range of bric-à-brac. The Melaka River Cruise is 45min boat ride on Sungai Melaka with audio commentary. The cruise offers new perspectives of the historical city centre, Chinatown, Kampong Morten and other places in Melaka. The River is where the town began and it has played a key role in Melaka's colourful history. Taking a river cruise is like seeing Melaka from the back door. In recent years it has had a major facelift. Yes, there has been a lot of new development but at the same time an effort has been made to preserve many of the historic buildings and bridges along the river. Even the newer buildings have been painted with colourful murals depicting different aspects of Malacca's rich history and culture. The Menara Taming Sari whereby from a height of 80 metres, the ride offers you a spectacular and panoramic view of Melaka UNESCO World Heritage City and a far with a host of interesting sights such as St.Paul's Hill, Independence Memorial Building, Samudra Museum and the ship, Flor De La Mar, Dataran Pahlawan, Pulau Selat Mosque, Pulau Besar and the Straits of Melaka. Take a ride and make your visit to historical Melaka, a truly joyous and memorable one. Space is limited, so please reserve early.

HERITAGE TRAIL OF MALACCA
Description

This is a city with a glorious past hidden behind each façade of the centuries-old buildings. The history of Malaysia is said to have begun in Malacca. It was a great seaport where the Portuguese, Dutch and British took turns to rule. Malacca is undoubtedly the wealthiest when it comes to history, culture and cuisine. Every step you take down the narrow winding streets, you will find a piece of historical treasure waiting to be discovered or an enchanting story waiting to be told. Let's take a stroll down memory lane because here is where it all began ... You will visit to the Stadthuys (outside visit only) – built as the official residence for the Dutch governors and their officers. It's an excellent example of Dutch architecture of that era. Porta de Santiago was built by the Portuguese in 1511 as a fortress and, during the Dutch invasion, it sustained severe structural damage. When the British took over Malacca, they set out to destroy it but the timely intervention by Sir Stamford Raffles in 1808 saved what remains of it today. The Portuguese built St. Paul's Church – originally named "Our Lady of the Hill", and St. Francis Xavier was briefly buried here in 1553. Then the Dutch came and turned the chapel into a burial ground. Your next stop will be the Cheng Hoon Teng Temple – the oldest Chinese Temple in the country. You will go on to Kampong Morten to see a Malay Living Museum, the Villa Sentosa where tea and local cakes will be served. Final Stop You'll also head to the Old Town to visit the Baba & Nyonya Heritage Museum, for an insight into the culture

originating from the intermarriage of local brides with Chinese immigrants.

CULTURE AND HISTORICAL MALACCA
Description

Your first stop will be at the State Mosque, Al Azim, which is approximately 2 kilometres away from Malacca. A great photo-stop as it was built using Sumatran architecture. Next you will drive to Mini Malaysia', a stupendous themed complex which enables visitors to view the traditional house styles of the 13 states of Malaysia. The complex displays authentic, life-size Malaysian houses, crafted by master builders. Each house has been furnished with corresponding elements, adding to the ambience of originality which captures the houses in their traditional setting. This complex has a built-up area of 5 hectares, and was officiated by the Prime Minister of Malaysia in 1986. You will have the opportunity to view the traditional houses located within the complex and also a traditional cultural ethnic performance from the state of Malacca, featuring Portuguese Baba Nyonya' dances- Next travel for Lunch via passing through Bukit Cina, and as the name implies, Chinese Hill' was the official settlement of the entourage that arrived with Chinese Princess, Hang Li Po. The entourage stayed within this settlement until the Portuguese arrived in 1511. Today Bukit Cina is believed to house one of the largest Chinese cemeteries outside of China, with many of the tombs dating back to the Ming Dynasty. After lunch your next stop will be at the Cheng Hoon Teng temple, the oldest Chinese temple in the country. Your final visit will be to Porta de Santiago, built by the Portuguese in 1511 as a fortress, which, when the Dutch invaded sustained severe structural damage. When the British took over Malacca, they had set out to destroy it, but a timely intervention by Sir Stamford Raffles in 1808 saved what remains of the fortress today. You will visit the Portuguese built St. Paul's church, originally named Our Lady of the Hill', where St Francis Xavier was briefly enshrined in 1553. After this the Dutch came and turned the chapel into a burial ground. You will also visit the Proclamation of Independence Memorial. The museum is housed inside a 1912 British Villa with mogul' style domes. Inside the museum, there are manuscripts, videotapes, films and slides depicting events leading to Malaysia's independence in 1957. Finally you will be head back to the pier by Trisshaw from Porta de Santiago.

WALK THE DUTCH TRAIL

Description

Melaka, once an old spice centre for Eastern and Western traders, has a colorful history involving its founder, the Malay Sultans, European powers and the formation of unique communities. These impressive historical eras have left their own unique heritage and influences for visitors to see and feel. The walking tour will help you to discover the great empires in Malacca, the Malay Sultanate, the Portuguese, the Dutch, and the British. The first venue will be the Dutch Square; the Stadthuys (outside visit) was built in the 1650s as the official residence for the Dutch governors and officers. It is a classic example of Dutch architecture, preserved in its original structure and form. Christ Church (outside visit), standing exactly where it has always been since 1753, is another landmark of the Dutch who defeated the Portuguese in 1641. Your next visit is The Governor's Museum, also known as Museum Yang Di-Pertua Negeri or Museum Tuan Yang Terutama, it is one of the many museums in Malacca. Formerly called Seri Melaka, the museum is housed in the former official residence and office of the Dutch Governor of Malacca on St Paul's Hill. The building was used as the official residence of the Tuan Yang Terutama, which is the title of the governor, until September 1996. The museum showcases the personal belongings of the various governors of Malacca since independence, beginning with the first Governor of Malacca, Tun Leong Yew Koh. Walking up St. Paul's Hill; you will see the ruins of the St. Paul's Church where St. Francis Xavier, a famous missionary, was buried in 1553. Walking up St. Paul's Hill, you will see the ruins of the St. Paul's Church where St. Francis Xavier, a famous missionary, was briefly buried in 1553. You will visit the hallmark of Malacca, one of the most photographed sites, the A'Famosa (outside visit), built by the Portuguese as a fortress. Coming down the hill to Porta de Santiago, you will also see wooden replica of the Malacca Sultan's Palace, built with great detail and refinement. You will return to the pier by the local colorful trishaw (pedal bike): an exciting and unforgettable experience to don't lose!!

MALACCA AND SURROUNDINGS

Description

This tour begins with a visit to a rubber tree plantation where you will be briefed on the process and end products of rubber. Malaysia produces almost 20% of the world's natural rubber. Rubber is elastic, flexible, airtight, watertight, long lasting and insulating, to mention just a few of its properties. There are thousand of products which take advantage of these useful properties. Some will be familiar to you, others less so because many rubber products do their work unseen. Most of the world's rubber is used in tires. You will then visit a Malaccan traditional house (outside visit), a splendid example of Malacca's 19th Century architectural and artistic style.. Next you will be travelling to the Dutch Square where you will have a photo opportunity of Queen Victoria Fountain & Souvenir Shopping. Our final stop before we return to the pier will be at the Porta de Santiago, built by the Portuguese and the Portuguese-built St. Paul's Church - originally named "Our Lady of the Hill", where St. Francis Xavier was briefly buried in 1553. Then the Dutch came and turned the chapel into a burial ground. You will also see Malacca's Sultan's Palace (outside visit), a replica of the original 15th century palace of Malacca's extinct Sultanate - it is now the Culture Museum. Before returning to the pier you'll stop at the Straits Mosque for a photo stop, from where you can admire the fascinating view of Malacca's bay.

Please Note: The order of the itinerary may vary. Space is limited, so please reserve early. When visiting the traditional house shoes should be removed and it's recommended to wear socks. Appropriate dress code for the mosque is the following: for ladies long pants or long skirt and long sleeves; for men trousers and adequate t-shirt or shirt.

GEORGETOWN AND SUBURBS
Description

You will travel past the main commercial district into the outskirts of Georgetown, passing the official residence of Penang's governor. On your way to the Botanical Gardens you will drive along roads lined with huge rain trees and flanked by handsome suburban houses and some of the beautiful colonial homes built during the period of British rule. You will stop at the Penang Botanical Gardens, also known as the Waterfall Gardens, for a pleasant stroll. The gardens were laid out by the British in 1884, and offer an extensive display of native and hybrid orchids, cacti, a wide variety of ferns, bamboo plants, flowering trees and shrubs. They are inhabited by long-tailed macaques, which will add some excitement to your visit. Visit the Thai Buddhist Temple, which houses the 4th largest Reclining Buddha in the world. You will then stop at the Baba Nyonya Museum, also known as the Pinang Peranakan Mansion or the Chung Keng Kwee Museum. This was formally a private home belonging to the Chinese head of the Hai San secret society. The building – an impressive Straits Eclectic-style mansion – is an architectural marvel. The late-Victorian influence is particularly clear in the profuse use of decorative cast iron, and this is one of the few buildings in Penang whose cast iron fixtures survived the Japanese occupation intact. You will marvel at the painstaking restoration of this house and its breathtaking antique furniture and woodwork. A Baba guide well versed in Baba Nyonya culture and Chinese Feng Shui will explain in detail what each carving, design, and painting depicts. This mansion is a storehouse of antiques. A life-size statue of Chung Keng Kwee himself, attired in his Mandarin's robe and a Manchu Mandarin cap, is displayed in his family temple next to the house. Before returning to the port, visit the bustling waterfront, where the houses on stilts form a water village built by the early Chinese immigrants, hinting at Penang's past.

From the bustle of Georgetown's waterfront to the countryside of Penang, this tour will allow you the chance to circle the island and admire some of its most interesting sights. Firstly visit the esteemed Khoo Kongsi where the walls, pillars and roof are richly decorated with intricate carvings bearing the marks of master craftsmen from China and the beams are made from wood of the finest quality. The temple was rebuilt in 1920 after it was gutted by fire. Some believe the fire was brought about because of the resemblance of the building to the Emperor's Palace in China. From here you will enjoy a leisurely drive towards the northern tip of Penang, passing beautiful coves and the bays of Batu Ferringhi with a stop at a local batik workshop, where you will be shown the intricate and timeless art of decorating fabric with wax and dyes. Scents of clove and nutmeg will follow as you drive through the hills, where you will stop at a local fruit and spice stall for a closer look at the fresh species and local fruits. Before going back to the ship, you will have the chance to see the other side of Penang, the quiet Malay villages, known as Kampung. These are scattered all over the island, giving you a true taste of the local life.

The park's **74 hectares**, which include a complete tropical forest and frangipani, rose, fern gardens and desert plants (to quote just a few), were recently awarded **UNESCO World Heritage Site** status, the first tropical garden in the world to boast this title.
- The area dedicated to the orchids houses **the largest collection of tropical orchids** in Asia, with more than 2,000 hybrid

varieties and 1,000 orchid species.

- Our tour continues onto Singapore's **ethnic areas** beginning with **Little India**, a lively and colourful area characterised by small stores, the aroma of spices and music. We will then continue onto **Arab Street**, a Muslim area specialising in Indonesian batik, silk, sarongs and various blouses; and then **Chinatown**, Singapore's cultural centre, which, with its temples, decorated balconies and lively roads offers insight on life in times past.
- Afterwards we will head to the colonial district, where we will board a **boat** to take us from Clarke Quay to **Merlion Park**. We will stop briefly to take some photos of the statue of **Merlion**, the mythological figure with a lion's head and mermaid's body which is now the symbol of the city, and admire the fascinating skyline of the **Central Business District**.
- Once lunch time arrives, we will head to **Blue Ginger**, a restaurant within a former shop which offers authentic **peranakan cuisine**, not to be missed whilst out in Singapore.
- With full stomachs and restored, we will continue on our tour and head to the **Singapore National Museum**: this cultural and architectural reference point in Singapore, which initiated its activity in 1887, is the nation's oldest museum whilst being forward thinking. Within the splendid architecture, the so-called "**10 national treasures**" are kept, which date back from the 14th century to the fifties, selected by the National Museum based upon their rarity, and more importantly, their incomparable relevancy in the context of Singapore's socio-cultural history.
- Our tour comes to an end with a stop at **Mount Faber**, where we can enjoy a unique view of the island of Sentosa and the skyline of Singapore; a view to be immortalised in photographic scenes.
- The itinerary may be subject to change.
- Comfortable shoes and clothing are recommended. Information will be provided in English on board.
- The boat is not air conditioned.
- We recommend that you book early because only a limited number of places are available.

Booking excursions

You can book your excursions before departure at www.mycosta.it by registering and filling in the online form or, on board, by using the interactive TV system from the comfort of your own cabin or by visiting the Excursions Totem (services only available on board selected ships), or at any stage during your holiday by dropping off a completed Tour Order Form in the drop box located in the main hall of the ship. Excursions Office staff will be happy to offer you advice and assistance.

Number of participants

Some excursions require a minimum number of bookings and/or a maximum number of participants. These excursions are available on a first come first served basis, so it is advisable to book them well in advance.

Duration

The stated duration of excursions is subject to change without prior notice and can vary due to unforeseen circumstances, such as adverse weather conditions and/or transport delays. The order of certain visits may also be changed for the abovementioned reasons. You are therefore kindly asked to respect the times announced by the tour guides (stops for food, stops to take photographs, etc.).

Description

The descriptions of excursions are correct at time of publication of this document. In an effort to offer you the highest quality excursions program, in some cases the descriptions may vary slightly from the excursions themselves.

Guests with limited mobility

Please contact our onboard staff the day before your cruise. They will advise you and try to obtain the necessary equipment for your on-shore excursion.

Prices

The prices of excursions include transport available on site, which might include coach, limousine, taxi, funicular railways or boats. Children and kids
